MOVE IN CREWS NEEDED!

MOVING IN - Residence Halls and Riverview Townhouses open for returning students at 12:00 noon on Sunday, January 22, 2017. **No accommodations can be made for early arrivals, so please plan accordingly.** For those students traveling from NYC, Trailways Buses have confirmed that they will bring students up to campus on Sunday, January 22. Residential students must check in at their building's office when they arrive in order to gain card access to the building.

CADI DINING SERVICES - MacDonald Dining Center will be open on Sunday, January 22, from 9:00 a.m. to midnight. The Campus Convenience store will be open Sunday, January 22, from 3:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Normal hours resume on Monday, January 30, 2017 (Monday – Thursday 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. and Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.)

Check Cashing – Your Campus Store provides a check cashing service for students. SUNY and College Association checks may be cashed up to \$100. You must have your SUNY Delhi student ID and there is a \$2.00 fee per check.

ACADEMIC PROBATION CONTRACTS - If you are on academic probation, you must complete and sign your probation contract **by 4:00 p.m. on the first day of classes –Monday, January 23, 2017.**

Business students should see Professor Barbara Sturdevant, Program Director, in Sanford Hall, Room 148A.

Hospitality students should see Dr. David Brower, Dean, in Alumni Hall, Room 111.

Liberal Arts and Sciences students should see their academic advisor in their advisor's office.

School of Nursing students should see their academic advisor in their advisor's office.

Veterinary Science students should see their academic advisor in their advisor's office.

Undeclared students should see their academic advisor in their advisor's office.

FAILURE TO SIGN YOUR ACADEMIC PROBATION CONTRACT WILL RESULT IN DISMISSAL FROM COLLEGE.

Carefully review your course schedule. If you have questions, see your academic advisor.

ACCEPTED CHARGES SURVEY - An online *Accept Charges Survey* must be completed by **ALL** students, including on-campus students, off-site students and online students via Bronco Web. The survey will be available beginning Monday, January 9, 2017. When you log into Bronco Web you will be presented with a survey that requires you to accept charges, thereby acknowledging that you will be/are attending the spring 2017 term. Failure to respond to the Accept Charges survey **may** result in your schedule being removed as a “NO SHOW” student. **The deadline to complete the Accept Charges survey is THURSDAY, JANUARY 26, 2017.**

SMOKING POLICY – As per New York State law, smoking is prohibited in all campus buildings and residence halls. As per SUNY

Delhi policy, smoking is defined as the use of a lit cigarette, cigar, electronic cigarette or any other form of smoking device. Smoking is permitted only in designated gazebos and parking lots.

SKATEBOARD BAN - Skateboards are **not permitted** on the SUNY Delhi campus and using them on college property, including the Riverview Townhouses, is a violation of the Student Code of Conduct. **Please leave your skateboard at home, or risk having it confiscated.**

STUDENT PIN – Your PIN is your password for Bronco Web, Campus Wireless, Degree Works, E-mail, GoPrint and Vancko Hall. Your PIN can be changed in Bronco Web.

PHONES - The Riverview Townhouse apartments are not on the campus telephone system. Students can contract with Delhi Telephone Company directly for phone and wired internet (DSL) service. There is one live phone line for each Townhouse and it is located in the living room. Riverview provides the phone handset.

BRONCO WEB - To access Bronco Web, go to www.delhi.edu, click “Current Students” and click Bronco Web. To login: Enter your User ID (which is your 800 ID number or you can enter your social security number) and your PIN. If you have forgotten your PIN, enter your 800 ID number, and then click the Forgot PIN? button. You will be asked the security question you initially provided, and you will set a new PIN when you answer the question correctly.

PRINTING CLASS SCHEDULES – Students in Good Academic Standing - All students in good standing may print their official class schedule from the Web after 5:00 p.m. on January 19, 2017. It is important to obtain your **official class schedule due to class cancellations, time changes, etc. Your schedule may be different from your tentative schedule developed in the fall.** Immediately after printing your official class schedule, check to see if you have a course MISC 9999 on your schedule. **BEWARE!** This is NOT a real course – it means that your schedule is incomplete and needs attention. See your academic advisor or contact your division office immediately! Computers in the Resnick Library will be available for use on Sunday, January 22, from Noon to 4:00 p.m. If you want to print your schedule, but have forgotten your pin number, follow the steps listed under “Student Pin.”

CAMPUS COMMUNICATIONS:

E-MAIL ADDRESS – All students have a campus e-mail address. Important announcements for students will be sent via campus e-mail. It is your responsibility to check your campus e-mail regularly for important announcements and information.

To find your e-mail address: Log into Bronco Web, click ‘Personal Information,’ then ‘View E-Mail Addresses,’ look under ‘SUNY Delhi Student E-mail System.’ Your e-mail address is your initials followed by a number, then @live.delhi.edu (ex: jd3@live.delhi.edu).

To login to your email account: Go to www.delhi.edu, click “Current Students” and click ‘Email.’ Enter your username (ex: gd23). Your password is your Bronco Web PIN.

ACADEMIC CAMPUS WIRELESS - The wireless network in non-Residence Hall buildings on campus is Delhi Secure Internet Service. For additional information, consult the Computer Information Services website, <http://www.delhi.edu/wireless> or contact the campus Help Desk at 607-746-4835, or email them at helpdesk@delhi.edu.

* With most devices you will connect to ‘DELHI-SECURE’.

* Select other devices connect to ‘DELHI-GUEST’.

* You will need to register your devices in order to have internet access.

* You can manage your BYOD at www.mydevices.delhi.edu

When registering (either on your device, or via www.mydevices.delhi.edu) your login is:

Username: First part of your email address. Ex: jd34

***NOTE: Do not put “@live.delhi.edu”, only jd34.

Password: Bronco Web PIN

MYRESNET INTERNET SERVICE - This wireless network offers you the ability to “Bring Your Own Device” (BYOD), allowing you to register your device only one time. You can easily self-register up to three devices at a time, including your mobile phone, tablet, laptop, gaming system, etc. For additional information, consult the MyResNet website (or chat live) at www.myresnet.com/, email support@myresnet.com, call 1-855-410-7378, or text “ResNet” to 84700.

CAMPUS ADDRESS FOR REGULAR & CAMPUS MAIL - ALL students taking classes on the SUNY Delhi campus have a mailbox, whether you live on campus, off campus or you are a commuter. Please keep your combination and mailbox information as it will also be your address next semester. If you have forgotten which mailbox is yours or you have lost your combination, stop by the Student Mail Center, Farrell Center Monday - Friday, between 8:00-9:30 am and 3:00- 4:00 p.m. Your campus address is as follows:

Remember, it is your responsibility to check your campus mailbox on a regular basis and you must present a photo ID to pick up packages.

BRONCO PACKAGE EXPRESS – Students are notified by the Bronco Package Express via their student email when a package is ready to be picked up at the Student Mail Center. Students can be notified via text message if you enter your cell phone number in Bronco Web under “Student Cell Phone.”

LOCAL ADDRESS REQUIRED FOR STUDENTS LIVING OFF CAMPUS - College policy requires that all students living off campus at a residence other than their family home, notify the college of their off campus address and phone number before **February 10**. Failure to do so will result in a hold being placed on your record. You should change your local address on Bronco Web or at the Registrar’s Office (124 Bush Hall).

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION – RAVE MOBILE SAFETY –SUNY Delhi is a member of the Rave Mobile Safety emergency notification system capable of delivering messages to your SUNY Delhi email address and personnel address, as well as your cell phone number. Manage your account at www.getrave.com/login/sunydelhi

ID CARDS - Remember to bring your student ID from last semester. If you lost your ID, you may get a replacement for \$15 in the [CADI](#) ID Office, Farrell Student and Community Center, beginning Sunday, January 22 from 12:00 noon to 4:00 p.m., or Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 12 Noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Federal regulations require all students receiving an ID card to present a government issued photo ID (driver’s license, passport, etc.). Failure to provide this information may result in a lapse in ID privileges.

PARKING PERMITS - If you are planning to bring a vehicle to campus and are a full-time student, you may purchase your parking decal online until January 20, 2017. After January 20, you must come into University Police located in North Hall to purchase your decal. Part-time students must register in person. All vehicles should be registered no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 23, 2017.

Option 1 - Register your vehicle online: Full time students should logon to their [Bronco Web account](#) and under the Student & Financial Services tab, click on the Parking Permits link. The spring semester parking fee of \$81 (\$75 & \$6 tax) may be paid by using a valid credit card, debit card, or E-check. **Your parking packet will be available for pick up at University Police from 7:00am a.m. – 5:00 p.m.**

Option 2 - Register in person: Full-time and part-time students: For your convenience, the University Police staff will be selling decals in North Hall, Monday – Friday from 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Please note: Temporary parking passes are available at University Police which is open 24 hours a day.

Students must park in student areas - please refer to Section II of the [Campus Parking brochure](#). Please do not park in visitor areas.

STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES –All SUNY Delhi bills are issued electronically and accessed via Bronco Web. An e-mail notification will be sent to your student Delhi email address as well as a paper bill to your permanent address on file. The bill indicates your financial obligation to SUNY Delhi for the spring 2017 semester. Full payment of your balance due is required before you return to Delhi. If you need to set up a payment arrangement or have questions about your bill, please call Student Financial Services at (607) 746-4570 or email us at studentaccounts@delhi.edu. You can access your financial aid on Bronco Web at http://www.delhi.edu/current_students . You will be able to view your award status and see if your paperwork is complete.
